#### Arizona State Rifle & Pistol Association Washington's Birthday Rifle Match

The match will be a modified 50-shot National Match Course in a 4-man team, all fired at 200-yards (Timed – standing, sitting / kneeling, prone). Shooters may use a NRA/CMP Service Rifle or any military, military-surplus or military-style rifle in as-issued condition, or as approved by match director. ## Ladies Shoot held August 29th

The WSC hosted yet another very successful outreach "Ladies Only Handgun Class" providing the ladies of our community with the basic knowledge, skills, and proper attitude necessary to SAFELY own and operate a firearm. The entire 4 hour program was conducted at the Range and began with handgun basics such as types, function and most importantly how to handle a firearm SAFELY. This was followed by live fire practice with each participant paired with an instructor to practice proper stance, loading procedures, grip, sight alignment and trigger squeeze. Approximately 50 rounds of ammo were fired by each shooter. While the main focus was on the safe operation and use of handguns the day ended with .22 rifles and a miniature steel chicken shoot. They all did great!

#### **New Range Safety Officer Work Station**

This project will provide some cover for the RSO's and it will be an extension attached to the rear of a Rifle Ramada. It will have paver flooring, chairs, and some cabinetry. All shooters will check in here upon arrival at the range.

This work will be coordinated with proposed Pistol ramada rear shelving installations, parking lot improvements, and a locker for targets. This is set for completion late summer / early fall.

Once these items are in place new aerial photographs will be taken & posted on our website.

#### **Sporting Clays**

WSC's membership has increased significantly since we officially introduced our Sporting Clays operation a few months ago. That means it is probably time for a recap of the operation to inform our newest members that WSC does indeed have a Sporting Clays operation.

Our website www.williamssportsmansclub.com has a complete description but here is a synopsis of the operation –

History: WSC absorbed what was formally the Flagstaff Clay Target Shooters operation in the fall of 2020. First official WSC shoot was May of 2021.

Location: The clays range is located at the Camp Raymond Scout Camp—approximately 12 miles SE of Williams, AZ at the south end of Garland Prairie.

Shoots: Conducted the fourth Sunday of each month. Number of shooters desired is from 6-12 with a start time of 0900. Each shoot is on a first come first served basis based on email responses.

The course is designed as a 50 round course of fire. While relatively small in physical layout, it does present a healthy challenge to even the most experienced shooters. If you are interested in busting some clays just shoot an email to wscaz2020@hotmail.com and your name will be added to the master clays email listing.

#### From the WSC Bylaws - Section 5. Rights, Privileges and Duties of Members

#### **Tactical Tips**

#### You have the right for a carry gun, you want one, now what?

If you believe it is a good idea to have a carry gun it should be something that is practical in size, has good performance, all while being controllable to shoot.

A .22RF derringer is very small and easy to carry but fails the performance requirement terribly. Likewise a .44 S&W Magnum is a superior performer but it is very difficult to master and conceal. Too small just doesn't do the job and too big hurts! Size matters! So what's a guy or gal to do?

One take away from our recent Ladies' Shoot was the experience a few had with the pistols that their husbands said were 'just perfect' for them. Some were too heavy, some too light or too small, for some recoil was an issue, some had sights that were terrible, some were complicated with multiple controls for the safety, magazine release, slide lock, etc., and some had heavy magazine and or slide (recoil) springs that made it a struggle for most folks to load and then rack.

Think about this for a moment. Did you buy your car without getting information first and then not even a test drive? I bet not so why would you do so with your carry gun? While there may not be a 'used gun lot' for you go to and 'kick some tires and look under the hood' and such but there are some alternatives.

Do you have friends who have a few pistols? Are they knowledgeable and experienced? Would they agree to some range time with you so you can try different makes, models and calibers out? And also consider coming to the range a few times just to see what others are doing and shooting. Watch them shoot and note the pistol's ease or difficulty of use. How about the recoil? Ask for their honest opinion, ask the RSO's. You can never get too much info.

# Ammo Crisis to worsen as Biden Administration Bans Import of Ammunition **NRA-ILA**INSTITUTE for LEGISLATIVE ACTION

The Biden Administration prohibited the importation of Russian ammunition effective September 7<sup>th</sup>. The NRA believes the restriction seems more aimed at punishing American gun owners and businesses than as a punitive foreign policy against Russia. While Russian ammo makes up a large part of the American ammunition supply it represents only a small percentage of the Russian GDP. This move by Biden will worsen the present supply problems, create more ammunition shortages, and bring higher prices.
