
Shotgun Range Activities

Sporting Clays

Tactical Tips

Concealed Carry Insurance – by Jerry Smiley WSC RSO

Let's talk about If you carry concealed and if you have ever thought about buying concealed carry liability insurance. Understanding what you are buying and what it covers is the foremost consideration. It seems the biggest player is Delta Defense which is part of the US Concealed Carry Association. I have carried a policy with them for several years. This coverage was for civil liability only and nothing towards any criminal charge. That said, USCCA sends the policy holder a wallet card with a number to call 24/7 in the event you are involved in a shooting

incident. That may well be your "one phone call." They will quickly hook you up with an attorney whose practice specializes in this area of law. Additionally, the back of the card gives you advice on what to do/say to police when they arrive.

Today you can buy \$1.1 million for \$347 or \$2.2 million for \$500 in civil liability coverage. And, if I understand what I was looking at there is some coverage for attorney's fees as well. It was not easy getting costs from the USCCA website. I found the above at www.valuepenguin.com. Of note for coverage to kick in you must use an attorney that they provide. In addition you can obtain coverage for criminal charges that may include bail bond funding, psych counseling, loss of income, etc. On the USCCA website you will find a full disclosure statement of all terms and conditions but be ready for a 15-page document. Much of it is standard boiler plate but it is must reading. You absolutely need to understand the coverage and limitations.

Listen folks, if you are prepared to intervene against an armed criminal then you must understand that even if you did the right thing your life is likely to become very stressful until the matter is fully sorted out. Therefore, all in all I think concealed carry insurance is a no brainer.

Happy New Year to All!

Welcome, January! A mix of mud, snow, and ice wherever we go. I could skate on my patio as the snow and ice melt and then re-freezes. Here are some important items you should use to prevent falls. None of us want to end up in the local Emergency Room with a fracture, head injury, or worse. And give yourself extra time this winter for forays outdoors.

This year I have switched to YAKTRAX Snow Trax micro spikes. They easily slip onto my boots or shoes for better grip in snow and icy conditions retailing for about \$15 and available at Amazon or sporting goods stores.



The second item that I recommend is trekking poles. I use a single pole for short walkabouts and two poles for more adventurous hikes. They cost about \$20 each. Trekking poles ensure that there are always at least two points of contact with the ground!

The third tip is to keep the "Ice Melt" handy. I use an empty (large) spice container, fill it with "Ice Melt" and when I find ice patches beside my car in parking lots I sprinkle the "Ice Melt" on the area. When I return from the store or business the ice is now water.

While you are out, be sure you are carrying a first aid kit, car Trauma Kit, water, food, extra socks, a blanket, and the aforementioned items in your car. Slide-offs happen (a lot) and winter is a time to be prepared for road closures, injuries, and changing weather conditions!
